Hematuria (Blood in the Urine)

Blood in the urine can either be VISIBLE or INVISIBLE (microscopic) but it is **NEVER normal**. This will need to be investigated by Dr. Davenport. We do some basic testing to rule out serious causes of blood in the urine. If we do not find a serious cause for bleeding, this is good, and Dr. Davenport will continue to see you periodically to see if the blood has resolved or is still present.

The FOUR main places that blood in the urine (hematuria) can come from are:

- 1) Kidneys
- 2) Ureters (tubes that carry urine to bladder)
- 3) Bladder
- 4) Prostate (In men only)

Main Causes of Blood in the Urine (Hematuria)

- 1) Urinary tract infections
- 2) Inflammation in the urinary tract
- 3) Kidney or ureteral stones
- 4) Cancer of the urinary tract
- 5) Recent trauma (kidney injury)
- 6) Other rare kidney disorders





WHAT DO WE DO NOW?

Specialized CT Scan (Urogram) or other study that shows us the kidney, ureters, and bladder in detail. The nurses will likely schedule this today with you if you haven't had it already.

Urine testing for cancer cells.

On your return to get the CT results, we will do a **cystoscopy** (a small camera that looks into the bladder for cancer). This usually takes 20-30 seconds with minimal discomfort.
